SITUATION UPDATE

On the second day of the conflict, a decisive blow was dealt to Iran's major SAM sites along the southern coast of Hormuz, expanding the operational airspace for our allied forces. In response, the Iranian Air Force intensified fighter sweep missions, exploiting the vulnerable southern coastal area lacking air defense support. To mitigate the escalating air threats, the CVN 71 strike group strategically increased Combat Air Patrol (CAP) flights on the third day, safeguarding friendly aircraft from airborne threats. Anticipating the imminent ground operation planned for the following day, the Commander General prioritizes neutralizing Iran's vital military assets in the coastal region. Targets include outposts, command centers, communication towers, and weapon storage facilities, aimed at diminishing Iran's defense capabilities. This concerted effort sets the stage for impending amphibious attacks by the ready and standby Marines, who are awaiting orders to initiate assaults and establish landing zones near Bandar-e Jask and Bandar-e Lengeh. On the evening of the third day, the Joint Commanding Center orchestrates a comprehensive air package, comprising pinpoint strike attackers, bombers, and a substantial air group dedicated to Target Area Combat Air Patrol. The VFA-97 Hawks squadron, deploying two flights each comprising four F/A-18C Hornets fighters, assumes the critical role of preventing hostile aircraft from infiltrating the operational area. In the upcoming night-time air combat operations, Navy pilots from the VFA-97 Hawks squadron leverage the advanced technologies of their F/A-18C Hornets to outmatch their adversaries flying Soviet-era machines. This tactical advantage positions them to successfully engage and defeat enemy forces, ensuring air superiority over the operational theater.



MISSION BRIEFING

Hawk 1-1 is the Air Mission Commander (AMC), whilst Hawk 1-2 is the Deputy AMC. The Hawks flights is assigned to perform TARCAP, protecting friendly aircraft in the operation zone from enemy airborne threat. All aircraft will start cold on deck, comms check will be performed in about 1 minute after right engine started, both team to keep PRI COMM at Green 1, and Hawk 1 to switch AUX COMM to Yellow 1 and Hawk 2 switch AUX COMM to Yellow 2. A/A Bullseye point is at WP2 (ROCK), Bingo fuel is 6,000 lbs, we also loaded with three external tanks to have enough reserve fuel for night time recovery or in case extended vul time is needed. Double check datalink and verify all members in Hawks flights are in your network. After being cleared by the taxi director, proceed to your assigned catapults.

Case III departure, after KILO, proceed to WP1 (RV) to regroup at 25,000 feet MSL with 0.6 Mach speed. The Devils and Colts Flights will takeoff from CVN-73 and LHA-1 Tarawa and proceed to the operation area by themselves, they will hold 20nm south of ROCK (Bandar-e-Jask) before we are on station. We will ingress by ourselves, when both flights are ready for push, switch PRI COMM to STRIKE, and Hawk 1-1 will give push order for WP2 (ROCK). Military power to climb to 35,000 feet MSL and increase to 0.80 Mach speed. At WP2 (ROCK), we will check in with STRIKE and get feet dry. After that, Hawk 1 and Hawk will go separate ways. Hawk 1 will proceed to WP3 (TSW), whilst Hawk 2 will proceed to WP4 (TSE). The line between WP3 and WP4 is the red line, we shall not let any Iranian fighters cross this red line, otherwise, they will become a major threat to our friendly aircraft in the operation area. Once we are on station, Devils and Colt 1 will run in to attack their assigned targets, and we will guard them.

Devils and Colt 1 need about 20 minutes to finish their attack, and our expected Vul Time is 30 minutes. WP3 and WP4 should be the mid point of Hawk 1 and Hawk 2 patrolling route, each flight will be flying on a 40nm horse race track pattern, refer to the chart in the briefing pack. Magic will provide AWACS to us, and generally speaking, we should engage them once they are 60nm from our redline. Grinder Tactic is our basic engaging tactic: Once a boggie is within 60nm, an element of two-ship will break from the flight to engage; after Fox 3 and pitbull, the engaging element could turn cold and so the other two-ship element could turn hot simultaneously. This is because most of the time, the Iranian fighters were just trying to lure us into the SAM trap they set up in the north, and we should avoid flying too deep into the north.

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Now talk about ground threats. The key SAM sites in the coastal area were already eliminated in the first two days, but there might be short-range mobile SAMs and Manpads in the area, so we should set our deck as 20,000 feet MSL. Also bear in mind that there are multiple SA-15 mobile SAM deployed in the Avartin mountain region but the precise locations of these vehicles are unknown. Further in the north, there is an active SA-10 Site around the Hamun-e Jaz Murian Lake, and SA-2 in Minab area, meaning, if you are 40nm from our TARCAP route, you are too deep in the north and you could be shot down by the enemy SAMs any moment. Be smart about that.

If all goes well, Devils and Colts flights will complete their mission in 25 minutes, and after they extracted from the operation area, we will be cleared to egress from our TARCAP station. We will regroup at WP5 (WET) at 30,000 feet MSL, fence out, and check out with STRIKE. Then we will egress together towards our expected recovery location around WP6 (REC). We will switch PRI COMM to Green 1 and contact Marshal for Case III Recovery. Although we have three external tanks, if we do need a drink, we could request recovery tankers. There aren't many sorties tonight so there shouldn't be too long waiting time for the recovery. Lastly, let's hope no one get Bolter or a WIRE 1 tonight. Good luck!

[Designer's Note]

1. Hawk 1-1 (Tail#211) is Mission Commander and must be seated by a Player.
2. A backup of Hawk flight consists of 4 F/A-18C (Hawk 3) is hot on ramp just in case needed.
3. Recovery tankers are ready on deck and will be launched upon request via F10 Radio Menu on your egress leg.
4. AI Hawk 2 will be activated if no Players sit into Hawk 2 Flight (after all Hawk 1 members outside DME-1), Players can use F10 Radio Menu to deactivate AI Hawk 2.

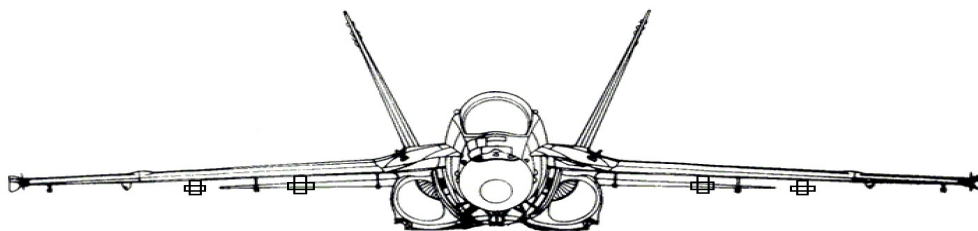


