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(U) OPERATIONS ORDER 125-2015-09 (Mission 07 – Storm Troopers):

(U) A-10C Sortie – Bombing Attack on Enemy Convoys

(S) Task Organization: JSOC / Operational Commander, Convoy Commander, Hawg Flight Lead, Hawg Flight Wingman.

I. Situation

(S) Rebel and terrorist forces have occupied key cities within the Country of Georgia. Al-Doran, SPIA, and other key terrorist organizations have flocked to the region to regroup, retrain, and strategize to take over Europe and spread their Islamic ideals to the world. A small United Nations peacekeeping force was ordered into the country under Resolution 435.1 to establish a Secure Zone and No-Fly Zone in the southern and central region of Georgia. The UN forces under strict rules of engagement were quickly overtaken by the rebel and terrorist forces in the region, and were forced to retreat. Coalition Forces led by the United States are tasked in bringing order back to the region, eliminate the terrorist nexus, and Capture or Kill High Value Targets / War Criminals who have engulfed the region. Enemy resistance has been very strong, and Intelligence Reports suggest many of the rebel and terrorist groups are receiving financial and supply assistance from Iran, Syria, IIPR, and possibly senior members of other Middle Eastern countries.

(S) Hawg Flight to depart Kutaisi AB enroute to WP2 (Road). Hawg Flight will scan the mountainous roadway at WP2 and engage six (6) enemy convoys. The convoys are believed to be heading East from WP2 to WP11.

A. Enemy Forces

(U) 1. Weather conditions in the AOR is stormy with high temperature in the high 70's. Overcast and stormy conditions are most likely. Moonlight illumination is 1/8 strength within the next 24-48 hours.

(U) 2. Terrain: The region consists of heavily forested areas, man-made and natural obstacles, urban areas, and variable elevation.

(U) 3. Identification of enemy forces: Al-Doran and Rebel forces will range from semi-skilled militia fighters in mixed military gear, to highly skilled infantry and anti-tank personnel with full body armor and light to heavy weapons. Armored assets and motorized infantry units have been spotted in the region. Fixed wing Air Support for the enemy is not likely. However, rotary assets are possible.

(S) 4. Location(s): Enemy forces consisting of light armor, transport trucks, and supply trucks are believed to be heading East along a mountainous roadway between WP2 and WP11.

(S) 5. Activity: Enemy activity in the region is on-going and imminent. Small scale to large scale indirect and direct attacks on coalition forces is prevalent.

(S) 6. Strength: Exact strength of the enemy force is unknown. Expect company, platoon, and squad size troop levels throughout the region. Morale of the enemy forces is very high. Enemy equipment ranges from small arms, crew-served weapons, heavy machine guns, anti-tank weapons, and light armor. The enemy force is believed to have the capability to reinforce key terrain within 4-6 hours with platoon to company size units.

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(U) 7. Probable course(s) of action when the enemy is contacted: Enemy convoys are expected to disperse and break contact when engaged. Contact Command for authorization for force on non-positive identified forces in the region.

(U) 2. Location and planned actions of units; Hawg Flight will conduct bombing runs on enemy convoys located on a mountainous roadway between WP2 and WP11.

III. Execution

Intent

(U) Neutralize six (6) enemy convoys located between WP2 – WP11.

A. Concept of the Operation:

Hawg Flight will depart Kutaisi AB enroute to WP2 (Road). Hawg Flight will scan the mountainous roadway at WP2 and engage six (6) enemy convoys. The convoys are believed to be heading East from WP2 to WP11. All enemy vehicles must be destroyed for mission success.

B. Tasks to Maneuver Units

(S) Hawg Flight is tasked with neutralizing enemy convoys in the Target AO.

(S) Flight leads will coordinate what movement speed, type of formation, and rules of engagement for their respective members. Whiplash-1 may dictate diversion in plans depending on the battlefield situation.

Return to Kutaisi Air Base. Fly upwind of airfield and flare six times to alert ground forces you are without radio communications. Tower will utilize light gun and give further instructions for landing. Pilot must be with 1.5 km's of airfield for proper utilization of manual / alternate communication methods.

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
